Job Summary	
<p>Physiotherapists help people recover with injuries sustained from surgery, illness, ageing or disability. They guide patients to improve their strength and movement and prevent further problems in future.</p> <p>Physiotherapists work to diagnose the causes of injury and put together a treatment plan, sometimes including exercises, manual therapy, and electrotherapy (using electrical energy as a medical treatment. They also advise on managing long-term conditions.</p>	
Main Responsibilities	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Meets the patient's goals and needs and provides quality care by assessing and interpreting evaluations and test results, determining physical therapy treatment plans in consultation with physicians or by prescription. ▪ Helps patient accomplish treatment plan and accept therapeutic devices by administering manual exercises, instructing, encouraging, and assisting patients in performing physical activities, such as nonmanual exercises, ambulatory functional activities, and daily living activities and in using assistive and supportive devices, such as crutches, canes, and prostheses. ▪ Administers physical therapy treatments by giving massages; initiating traction; applying physical agents; utilizing hydrotherapy tanks and whirlpool baths, moist packs, ultraviolet and infrared lamps, and ultrasound machines; directing treatments given by aides, technicians, and assistants. ▪ Evaluates effects of physical therapy treatments and fit of prosthetic and orthotic devices by observing, noting, and evaluating patient's progress, recommending adjustments and modifications. ▪ Completes discharge planning by consulting with physicians, nurses, social workers, and other health care workers, contributing to patient care conferences. ▪ Assures continuation of therapeutic plan following discharge by designing home exercise programs; instructing patients, families, and caregivers in home exercise programs; recommending and/or providing assistive equipment; recommending outpatient or home health follow-up programs. ▪ Maintains patient confidence and protects center's operations by keeping information confidential. □ Maintains safe and clean working environment by complying with procedures, rules, and regulations. □ Protects patients and employees by adhering to infection-control policies and protocols. ▪ Ensures operation of equipment by completing preventive maintenance requirements; following manufacturer's instructions; troubleshooting malfunctions; calling for repairs. ▪ Maintains professional and technical knowledge by attending educational workshops; reviewing professional publications; establishing personal networks; participating in professional societies. ▪ Develops physical therapy staff by providing information, developing, and conducting in-service training programs. ▪ Contributes to team effort by accomplishing related results as needed. ▪ To participate in research and educational conferences held by ACPN.

Clinical Psychologist-Child and Adolescence

Minimum Qualification, Experience & Skills

- HAAD/DHA /MOH Valid License or eligibility to obtain the same.
- Master's degree in clinical psychology with practicum and internship/residency experience
- At least 2 years postmaster experience working as a licensed clinical psychologist.
- Licensed in country of origin (mandatory)

Job Summary:

- To provide specialist evidence based psychological assessment, formulation, and therapy, and make autonomous clinical decisions about own professional practice.
- Provide consultation and advice on psychological therapies to clients, their families and non-psychology colleagues.
- To work with patients across the lifespan (adults and children, unless otherwise agreed).

Job Duties: N.B. All Job Descriptions are subject to review and amendment at any time as dictated by company needs.

Clinical

- To work autonomously to provide high quality evidence-based therapies to individual and groups of patients.
- Manage a caseload of patients with responsibility for confidentiality, assessment (including risk), formulation and therapy.
- To spend a minimum of six out of eight sessions engaged in face- to-face work with patients each day (pro-rata for part time staff) unless otherwise agreed.
- To offer assessment; routine (i.e., intake interviews) and complex assessments to patients (i.e., risk assessment, psychometric, and neuropsychological where appropriate etc.) and provide reports when necessary.
- To proactively contribute to the achievement of good clinical outcomes for patients and evaluate the efficacy of the therapies provided using standardized outcome measures.
- To manage patient risk effectively.
- Communicate with patients and their families (as clinically needed) in a way that is open, sensitive, empathic, and caring.
- To work with multidisciplinary team colleagues to develop comprehensive care plans.
- To make appropriate referrals when necessary and be responsible for following these up.

Teaching, training, and supervision:

- Participate in monthly clinical supervision – internally or externally.
- To deliver teaching/training/presentations when required.

General

- Contribute to service development and innovation.
- To attend monthly team meetings and contribute to these.
- Use IT systems effectively.
- Record all information accurately and maintain up to date clinical records using the elite system.

WORKING AS PART OF A TEAM

- Maintain professional relationships with colleagues whilst being mindful of appropriate boundaries.
- Participate in the annual appraisal process.
- Maintain a good working environment by being respectful and compassionate towards colleagues.

- Maintain registration with DOH, DHA or CDA alongside professional registration in country of registration.
- Comply with all ACPN policies, procedures, and protocols.
- Maintain professional approach to work.
